Letter from the Executive Director Erin Drew

Dear Friends,

Families are at the heart of everything we do. They are the foundation of strong communities, the first place where children learn and grow, and a source of connection and support that shapes a child's future. Yet, we know that parenting—while deeply rewarding—can also be challenging, and no one should have to do it alone.

This past year has been filled with moments that reflect the strength of the families we serve. Parents and caregivers came together to learn, share, and support one another. Children discovered new ways to play, explore, and grow. The Family Place continued to be a welcoming space where families could find connection, encouragement, and the resources they needed.

One of the year's milestones was expanding access to parenting education. For the first time, we offered a Circle of Security class in Spanish, ensuring more families could benefit from this valuable program. We also continued to provide The Incredible Years and Circle of Security classes, equipping parents with the tools to nurture strong relationships with their children. Our Circle of Parents groups, with Kids Circle running alongside, provided a space for families to build peer-to-peer relationships, supports, and share their experiences while build lasting connections.

Our Brevard location saw thoughtful improvements, creating an even more engaging and welcoming environment for families. With new play materials designed to inspire creativity and learning, children found more opportunities to explore and grow.

Through our Connect program, we deepened our ability to link families with essential resources. The addition of bilingual Connect Outreach Workers helped expand our reach, ensuring more families could access the support they needed.

This year also brought a transition, as TC STRONG became its own 501(c)(3) organization. We wish them the best as they continue their important work supporting youth mental health.

At The Family Place, every moment of connection, every shared experience, and every step forward for a family reinforces why we do what we do. As we look ahead, we remain committed to ensuring that no parent or caregiver feels alone in their journey. Thank you for being part of this work—your generosity, time, and belief in our mission make all the difference.

The Family Place & the 5 Protective Factors

The Family Place offers programs to the community, all of which embrace the Five Protective Factors which are the foundation of the Strengthening Families Approach. Research studies support the common-sense notion that when these factors are well established in a family, the likelihood of child abuse and neglect diminishes. These protective factors help build family strengths and a family environment that promotes optimal child and youth development. These attributes serve as buffers, helping parents find resources, support or coping strategies that allow them to parent effectively, even under stress (Center for the Study of Social Policy).

Our Programs

Open Play

Both the Brevard and Rosman locations are available for open play, providing indoor and outdoor areas where children can freely play and explore with many toys and activities offered. This program allows participants to connect with The Family Place team and other families, and discover the range of programs we offer.

Playgroups

Playgroup is a time for children and their caretakers to explore and learn together in a preschool-like setting. Our children's program facilitator leads art activities, games and stories.

Circle of Parents® - We facilitated six distinct groups, each led by a trained facilitator. These included a weekly *Parent Chat* at both the Brevard and Rosman sites, as well as specialized groups tailored to specific parenting experiences: *Navigating Needs* for parents of children with special needs and disabilities, a group for *Foster & Adoptive Parents*, a space for *Parents of Teenagers*, and a dedicated support group for *New Moms* navigating the journey of their first child.











Circle of Security[®] Parenting

Circle of Security© Parenting is an 8-week program designed to improve parent-child relationships. A meal and childcare are provided. This program is available in English and Spanish.

The Incredible Years®

The Incredible Years® is a 14-week program that focuses on strengthening the parent/child relationship and is recommended by the American Psychological Association Task Force. A meal and childcare are also provided.

Program Impacts

Circle of Parents

87% of children demonstrate an increase in developmental improvements 98% of parents demonstrate an increase in parenting skills, knowledge and attitudes 98% of parents demonstrate an increase in parent-child interactions/relationships

For the period of July 2023 to June 2024, 24 parents/caregivers participated in the evaluation of Circle of Parents Programming offered by The Family Place. Analyses show an overall positive impact of programming on parenting knowledge, skills and behaviors

Statistically significant increase in all five Protective Factors after participating in COP:

- Nurturing & Attachment
- Concrete Support
- Social Support
- Family Functioning & Resiliency

Circle of Security

93% agree or strongly agree that participating in the program was helpful84% of parents recognize that their past experiences influence their parental responses94% of parents feel that they can be with their child in all of their feelings

Incredible Years

58% of children demonstrate increased independence carrying out personal routines58% of caregivers show a decrease in parental depression60% of caregivers demonstrate an increase in parental self-confidence

Analyses of the Adapted Parenting Practices Interview (APPI) show a significant positive impact of the Incredible Years programming on the following factors:

- Increase in positive parenting Increase in appropriate monitoring
- Decrease in harsh discipline Decrease in inconsistent discipline

Connect

"Connect" is a community collaborative in which The Family Place serves as the fiscal agent and executive team. Our mission is to empower families and promote the well-being of the community's children. Connect coordinates services for families in crisis or at high risk for child maltreatment. We address fundamental needs and foster resilience to make a lasting positive impact on the lives of families within our community.



5-year Financial Trends FY 2018-2023




Net Assets, Contributions and Grants FY2024 — highest since 2019
